



PARENTS GUARDIANS AND SPECTATORS

What to report and to who?

SWFA Behaviours and Cultures (That doesn't come under another category)

Examples:

- ·Anti-social behaviour from Parents, fans or club staff.
- ·A Coach, Team official or Parent consistently shouting at players in a way that discourages or embarrasses them, without using abusive or discriminatory language.
- ·Clubs and Teams that aren't being inclusive.
 ·Behaviour that doesn't violate rules but undermines the environment in which the game is played.
